Introduction

This Postgraduate Research Directory describes 510 current research projects in the field of social policy. These projects are being conducted by postgraduate students as either PhD or Masters by research throughout Australia. The Directory represents the first attempt to bring information about such work together in the one resource.

As with other innovations, however there are limitations to this Directory, some of which can be attributed to problems inherent in the postal survey method that was adopted for its compilation. Initially, over 700 survey forms were sent out to the appropriate Schools and Departments in every University in Australia. With the recent amalgamations and reforms in tertiary education it was difficult to obtain a comprehensive and accurate list of all the appropriate Departments and Faculties within the various institutions. We asked the heads of Faculties, Departments or Schools to pass our request letter to any other appropriate division within the University, in an effort to ensure all relevant people were contacted. Around three hundred responses were obtained in the first round and a reminder letter elicited a further two hundred responses. The information in these responses forms the body of this Directory. It is presented in the format described in the section below, each project being grouped in a section according to the University in which it is being undertaken. A total of 89 replies were received from University Departments reporting they currently had no postgraduate students conducting research in the field of social policy. These appear at the end of the Directory in Appendix Two.

A further limitation of the survey method for collecting the relevant research was the effect of self selection. We did not define social policy, nor did we provide guidelines for the type of research work which we would have considered suitable, preferring to cast as wide a net as possible for work in the field of social policy. Consequently a divergent range of research topics was submitted suggesting that social policy is being very broadly defined within academia. However, there may well be other institutions or sections within institutions which, because of a narrower or more specific definition of social policy, did not deem their students' work as suitable for submission to the Directory.

Although we have made every attempt within the resources available to ensure that the Directory is as comprehensive as possible, the diversity of research which may be considered as falling within the scope of social policy means that this Directory can only be an incomplete record.

Technical Note

This Directory has been compiled with information supplied from universities throughout Australia. This was obtained through the Social Policy Research Centre's request for information about the research being undertaken in the field of social policy by postgraduate students (see Appendix One for proforma and covering letter). The information presented in the Directory appears exactly as it was submitted to the Centre on the form. Where the responses were difficult to interpret, best estimates were made of the information. With over 500 entries in the Directory, it was not possible to contact each respondent to check spelling, and we apologise if we have misspelt any names.

Where any item of information was not supplied to us, such as a description of the research, or commencement date, we have excluded that data from the particular entry in the Directory.

The research topics have been arranged here under alphabetical listing by University and each entry has been given a record number. Keywords were assigned to indicate the nature of each project. These Keywords were assigned on the basis of information supplied and are therefore restricted by the quality of that information. In some instances the information provided was scant, affording few clues as to the possible nature of the research thus making the allocation of Keywords which might best describe it difficult. We believe the best efforts have been made to ensure that all research is fairly represented by the Keywords assigned. Multiple Keywords were assigned where this was thought appropriate. An index lists each Keyword which is followed by a group of record numbers indicating which research projects fall within that category. This index allows users with a special interest in a particular topic to find those projects relevant to that interest.

'Stage' in the degree has been variously defined as first, second, third or fourth, final, data collection, and examine. It appears that various universities use different terms for the progression through their postgraduate degrees. We have presented 'stage' as it appeared on each form submitted to us.

Addendum

Several forms from the University of Western Australia were received after the Directory had been compiled but before it went to press. It was not possible to include these forms in the existing grouping for the University of Western Australia, so a second entry for that University was created at the end of the Directory and the entries numbered accordingly. Keywords were assigned and referenced in the usual way. Thus the University of Western Australia appears twice in the alphabetical list of Universities.
